You've made Julio a happy dad!

Mary MacKillop Today relies on your support to make a difference in the lives of parents in Timor-Leste, where many are not able to be involved in their children's education. This is often because they have not had the opportunity to go to school, resulting in a lack of basic literacy, with many not being able to read or write. For parents, not being able to engage at home with their children's learning can be disempowering and it's vital for children's long-term development to have their education supported at home. Mary MacKillop Today partnered with the Edmund Rice Foundation Australia, who received support from the Australian Government through an Australian Aid: Friendship Grant, to address this need. Recently, Julio, 33 years old and father of two boys and two girls, received an invitation to attend our parents program training workshops.

"I was really happy when I received the letter from my children that Mary MacKillop Today will do the training at our place... and I am really thankful and hoping that Mary MacKillop Today will continue to provide more training..."

During our parents program, Julio, along with all the participants, was provided with educational books and games to use with his children at home as well as reading and writing activities. Julio also learned some new action songs and how to develop his and his children's understanding about their rights and responsibilities. At the end of the workshop, Julio was given the opportunity to try out his new and improved skills with a class of children, under the guidance of our amazing parents program team. Julio's wish is that other parents living in remote areas, who have the same hopes and dreams for their children, can also receive the training to help increase their children's future potential.





There were even insightful articles in local media, including the Sydney Morning Herald featuring Benjamin's story and promoting his delicious jams. All of us here at Mary MacKillop Today are proud of all of Benjamin's achievements. His and his family's hard work and dedication raised an incredible \$3000 of much need funds that will help continue to transforms the lives of so many through our our education programs in Timor-Leste. Benjamin saw a need and took action, exemplifying and honouring the legacy of Saint Mary MacKillop:

You're transforming lives in PNG!

Mary MacKillop Today's Inclusive Communities is a vital program in Papua New Guinea aiming to increase access to inclusive health and education services while raising awareness of the rights of people with disability in remote village communities. People with disability in PNG face discrimination, segregation, isolation as well as social and physical barriers that restrict their ability to fully participate in society. Our partnership with Callan Vanimo Inclusive Education Resource Centre enables volunteers to be trained to assess, identify and refer people with disability to available health services while also holding community days and raising awareness about the rights of people with disability through engaging, fun and creative activities. It's estimated that

955,000 people in PNG living with disability do not have access to social support, health services or education. Last year, thanks to you, the number of our volunteers increased by 11 to 31 with an additional 77 people with disability identified by our volunteers. Our volunteers work to determine the level of support required to enable all to achieve their social, educational and health goals, transforming their lives. This project received support from the Australian Government through an Australian Aid: Friendship Grant.

Connecting communities!

Mary MacKillop Today's Community Grants Program partners with organisations to improve the lives of Australia's most vulnerable and marginalised people through education in all its form. Since 1995 our Community Grants Programs has invested in over 600 life-changing projects, including the House of Welcome, run by St Francis Social Services in NSW. The House of Welcome exists to welcome, shelter and empower refugees and people seeking asylum, including providing training and work opportunities with their catering social enterprise. Last year Mary MacKillop Today assisted with the House of Welcome's efforts in supporting the need for social interaction and mental well-being for those living in a new country and new community, with limited resources. One way this was achieved was through a day trip to Kiama, where a group of local volunteers were connected with refugee and asylum seeking families. It was a wonderful cultural exchange opportunity which included a lovely lunch and afternoon tea. The group also visited local attractions giving many families, who are often isolated, the chance to connect and experience a very warm Aussie welcome, all of which was very gratefully received.
