### "We were able to get back on our feet."

A serious motor vehicle accident put Tony\* in hospital for three years. His injuries meant he could no longer work — plunging his family into financial stress.

Tony shares, "It's been hard because I went from running successful businesses to having to live on a pension. Believe me, I was crying because we were in such a difficult situation."

Fortunately, Tony and his wife, Lauren\*, came to Mary MacKillop Today to meet with Emma, our Financial Counsellor. Emma supported Tony and Lauren through regular meetings to help improve their financial situation, such as managing a budget and financial planning.

Lauren says, "Emma didn't make us feel like a failure. She had empathy. Emma helped us sort out things, like our electricity and gas bills and get some savings together for a decent car. We were able to get back on our feet. Now, we can afford more things. And we've got less debt. Less stress."

### "Now I no longer feel heavy, because I have been trained."

In Timor-Leste, a recent study showed that by the end of Grade 1, 70% of students could not read a single word presented to them. This is why Mary MacKillop Today's Volunteer Teacher Support Project provides mentoring and support to volunteer teachers from remote areas.

Belarmino has been teaching preschool children for 13 years.

"Before I attended the training with Mary MacKillop Today, I was finding it very hard because there was no method for teaching children." said Belarmino.

After receiving his training, he states, "I have learned how to teach in the classroom and teach children in ways that make them interested. Now I no longer feel heavy, because I have been trained, and have found a way to reach children."

Belarmino also speaks of the joy he has in the classroom now that he has support.



"I've continued teaching because I've been proud to see kids read, write, and learn. Seeing them pick up their own books from Mary MacKillop Today makes me feel so proud... I thank Mary MacKillop Today and the donors for the training and support. May we continue this activity, especially in rural areas." Thanks to kind people like you, teachers like Belarmino can continue their important work as educators for the next generation.

### Resilient mothers in Fiji set a new path for themselves.

In a rural community in Fiji, a group of single mothers facing psychosocial disabilities struggled to create a better life for themselves and their children. Burdened with the sole responsibility of raising children with no access to employment themselves, these women were desperate for change.

Generous people like you are helping to provide an opportunity to change the path these women face. One of Mary MacKillop Today's newest projects in Fiji is the Pathway to Economic Independence Project, led by our local partner, Psychiatric Survivors Association. This project aims to help people who are living with mental health issues in vulnerable situations, create financial independence.



Women who participate in this project gain tangible skills like basket weaving, mat weaving, making wreaths for functions, jewellery making, and fabric art printing. Many of these women have come together to sell their products and earn an income collaboratively. Others have started their own screen printing and jewellery-making businesses.

During this training, women also learnt about the importance of mental health and emotional coping mechanisms to help them handle the stress of day-to-day life. Being a part of this project has become a safe space of life-changing transformation for the local Fijian women involved.
