## Margaret regains a financial peace of mind

Margaret\*, an 86-year-old grandmother from Bathurst, has spent most of her life living modestly. However, recent times have become increasingly challenging due to the cost-of-living crisis.

Things took a turn for the worse when Margaret was offered a cash instalment plan through her credit card provider. While the plan provided her with cash to help cover living expenses, it came at a steep price—her monthly card repayments more than doubled.

As she relies on a fixed income from her age pension, Margaret struggled to meet the repayments, which seemed never-ending. This left her in a difficult position, as the monthly payments consumed most of her pension which negatively impacted her already fragile health due to a heart condition.

Fortunately, Margaret reached out to Mary MacKillop Today and met with Emma, our Financial Counsellor. Emma contacted Margaret's credit card provider, explaining that the cash instalment plan had been offered without proper consideration of her ability to afford it.

Thankfully, the credit card provider took her situation into account. After reviewing her case, they agreed to waive the remaining balance on Margaret's credit card and close the account.

With a sense of relief, Margaret cut up her card, freeing herself from the burden of the monthly bills that had caused her so much stress. Margaret shared "Although I no longer have access to my credit card, I feel so much better as I have peace of mind knowing that I'm not being drained by debt I can't afford."

Thanks to your generosity, people like Margaret are turning their financial situations around.

## "The workshops taught me to be stronger... and to find a support network."

Sonia is the President of the Bicentennial Women's Organisation in her town in the province of Quispicanchi, Peru.

She has been a participant of the 'Enhancing Women's Civil Participation in Rural Peru' project, led by our local partner CCAIJO, for the last few years.

"Before I joined the women's organisation, I was going through difficult times. My mental health was not good, and I was neglecting my daily activities. But, once I was elected as a representative of the organisation, I began to emerge from the depressive period I was experiencing.

The workshops I took part in taught me to be stronger. There are women like me who have issues who can't say it openly, but this space allows us to share and learn.

At first, I was surprised to see that in other districts there



were many women organised and strengthened. And I asked myself: Why can't we, in this town, be as organised? That's where we started. We have already made our work plan, and we are walking to other communities to bring this message to more women.

Sometimes my husband thinks I'm wasting my time being involved. I tell him that women must find a space for ourselves, where we feel happy, calm and free to express ourselves. We learn about our rights, such as the right to political participation and healthy coexistence through workshops, and meetings and this allows us to recognise ourselves as complete citizens.

My greatest dream is for women to understand that when we are united...we can build a peaceful home, and a healthy society."

Thanks to your compassion, women like Sonia are taking on leadership roles that are changing the lives of their families and communities forever.

# "I was struggling to teach my children at home... Now this has changed!"

Beatriz lives with her husband and six children in a small village near the north coast of Timor-Leste. She runs a small business from home and ensures that all her children complete their homework – a significant challenge given Beatriz didn't finish her own schooling.

Beatriz was eager to share her experiences with the Parents Training Program which is supported by generous supporters like you.

"During the two weeks of training, I learnt how to make presentations in front of the class, how to read storybooks, how to cut letters out of used cardboard, and how to teach our children at home. I also learnt about child protection. This is new to me, and Mary MacKillop Today gave us great ways to pay attention to our children to work out if they need help.

Before I did the training, I used to hold my children's hands to help them write. However, with the training, I learnt how to teach my children with the alphabet in a simple but easy way.

The teachers only have a few hours to work with my children but now I realise that I can continue this work at home. That even before they get to school, they can already be learning!"



## "The more people that Mary MacKillop Today can help... the better."

Chris' connection to Saint Mary MacKillop began in 2002 when he was diagnosed with a nonterminal form of leukemia. A visit to Mary MacKillop Place in North Sydney during his treatment had a profound impact on him he became inspired by Mary's unwavering commitment to those in need.

As Chris learned more about Mary's story, he also discovered the work of Mary MacKillop Today, which continues to resonate with him.

He explains, "I particularly like the way that Mary MacKillop Today works with communities in helping people to look after themselves. It gives people a sense of belonging and lifts their self-esteem when they learn new skills. They can then teach others in their community." Chris recognises that one of the most meaningful ways he can make a lasting difference is by supporting the future of Mary MacKillop Today.

"God calls us to help those in society who are less fortunate than ourselves, and one of the best ways to do this is to leave a bequest," he says.

For him, the decision to leave a bequest was straightforward. By doing so, he ensures that the work of Mary MacKillop Today continues to impact lives for generations to come.

Chris takes pride in knowing that his bequest will be used to empower others, giving them the same sense of hope that Mary inspired in him so many years ago.

Sr Monica Cavanagh, Congregational Leader of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, shares her remembrance of his Holy Holiness, Pope Francis.

"The Sisters of Saint Joseph join Catholics and people around the world to mourn the death of Pope Francis. Pope Francis cared for the poor and those on the edge. He also had a willingness to meet with world leaders and was not afraid to speak his truth.

It was my privilege to meet Pope Francis on two occasions while involved with International Union of Superiors General. On these occasions, he was ready to engage with the questions of Women Religious. He was particularly interested in those Religious living in war torn situations, those working with refugees, and those working in poverty-stricken areas. His warmth and openness were evident.

In 2023, Pope Francis held a General Audience, focusing on the life and example of Saint Mary MacKillop. "One essential characteristic of her zeal for



the Gospel," said Pope Francis, "was her desire to care for the poor and marginalised. This pushed her to go where others refused or were unable to go."

Pope Francis noted that Saint Mary MacKillop learned to love the Cross of Christ and found her own way to respond to the needs of her times.

"May her efforts to form young people inspire us today," he prayed, "and may her intercession sustain the daily work of parents, teachers, catechists, and all educators, carried out for the good of young people and a future that is more humane and full of hope."

## "Mary MacKillop Today is Saint Mary MacKillop in action in this day and age."

Mary has been a generous monthly donor supporting the work of Mary MacKillop Today since 2013. Her connection to Saint Mary MacKillop and the Josephite Sisters began when she was a young girl attending a Josephite school.

Mary shares: "I was inspired by the Sisters to become a teacher myself and spent forty years teaching in Catholic schools in South Australia. For many years, I have been a Josephite Companion and this led me to becoming the Chair of the Josephite Companions Leadership Team (JCoLT) in 2013. In my role as Chair, I visited Peru in 2016 and travelled around the country to where Sisters were working and witnessed Mary MacKillop Today's work in action. It was incredible to meet some of the women involved in the Ethica Project in Lima – one women told me how the project helped save



her husband's life as they could now afford his medications.

While in Peru, I got a serious toothache, and was taken to the local dentist, who had received his training thanks to a scholarship from Mary MacKillop Today. I witnessed first-hand the difference these programs were making to communities!

In 2017, I was invited to visit
Timor-Leste and sat in on a
Mary MacKillop Today Parents
Training session. The parents
were learning basic skills they
could do with their children at

home – like learning to count by using stones from their garden. I realised how much we take for granted here in Australia about education and the resources we can access. I was very blessed to see this project in action.

I'm so proud to be a regular donor. By making this commitment, I'm supporting Mary MacKillop Today's ability to plan for the future. I have a sense of self-satisfaction knowing that my regular donation will make a difference over time."
